

MEET THE COMPOSER

SERGEI PROKOFIEV IS
RECOGNIZED AS ONE OF THE
MAJOR COMPOSERS OF THE
20TH CENTURY. HE WAS A
PIANIST, COMPOSER, AND
CONDUCTOR. AS A CHILD,
PROKOFIEV WAS INSPIRED BY
HIS MOTHER WHO WAS
LEARNING THE PIANO. SHE
EVEN WROTE DOWN HIS FIRST
PIANO COMPOSITION WHEN HE
WAS JUST FIVE YEARS OLD!
HE WENT ON TO COMPOSE HIS
FIRST OPERA BY AGE 9.



SERGEI PROKOFIEV

IN 1936, PROKOFIEV WAS COMMISSIONED BY NATALYA SATS, THE DIRECTOR OF THE CENTRAL CHILDREN'S THEATRE IN MOSCOW, TO WRITE A MUSICAL SYMPHONY FOR CHILDREN. SATS AND PROKOFIEV HAD BECOME ACQUAINTED AFTER HE VISITED HER THEATRE WITH HIS SONS SEVERAL TIMES. THE INTENT WAS TO INTRODUCE CHILDREN TO THE INDIVIDUAL INSTRUMENTS OF THE ORCHESTRA TO ENJOY MUSIC AND LEARN TO RECOGNIZE MUSICAL KEYS. IN THIS SYMPHONIC TALE, THE NARRATOR TELLS A RUSSIAN FOLK TALE, WHICH THE ORCHESTRA ILLUSTRATES BY USING DIFFERENT INSTRUMENTS TO PLAY A THEME THAT REPRESENTS EACH CHARACTER IN THE STORY.

THE STORY



PETER IS A YOUNG BOY WHO LIVES AT HIS GRANDFATHER'S HOME IN A FOREST. ONE DAY, PETER GOES OUT INTO THE MEADOW LEAVING THE GARDEN GATE OPEN. HE MEETS SEVERAL ANIMAL FRIENDS LIKE THE DUCK AND THE BIRD. A NEARBY CAT SEES THE BIRD AND MIGHT WANT TO MAKE HIM HIS DINNER! SO PETER WARNS THE ANIMALS AND THEY ALL GET TO SAFETY.

UPON RETURNING TO THE HOUSE, GRANDFATHER SCOLDS FOR LEAVING THE GATE OPEN BECAUSE THERE'S A BIG, BAD WOLF IN THE AREA!

AS SOON AS PETER AND HIS GRANDFATHER ARE SAFELY LOCKED BACK IN TEH HOUSE, THE WOLF COMES OUT OF THE FOREST. THE WOLF CATCHES THE DUCK AND SWALLOWS HER. THE WOLF TURNS HIS ATTENTION TO THE CAT AND THE BIRD, WHO ARE UP IN A TREE. PETER WATCHES ALL OF THIS AND MAKES A PLAN TO CAPTURE THE WOLF.



PETER AND THE BIRD WORK TOGETHER AND CATCH THE WOLF WITH A ROPE. WHEN THE HUNTERS ARRIVE, PETER ASKS THEM TO HELP TAKE THE WOLF TO THE ZOO. IN CELEBRATION, EVERYONE PARADES THE WOLF TOWARDS HIS NEW HOME. THE DUCK IS STILL ALIVE AND CAN BE HEARD QUACKING INSIDE THE WOLF.





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
THE CHARACTERS





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

MEET THE COMPOSER

BRUCE ADOLPHE IS A COMPOSER, EDUCATOR, PERFORMER, AND AUTHOR WHOSE MUSIC IS PERFORMED WORLDWIDE BY RENOWNED ARTISTS, INCLUDING YO-YO MA, ITZHAK PERLMAN, FABIO LUISI, JOSHUA BELL, AND MANY, MANY MORE. HIS BOOKS AND OTHER WRITINGS ARE PUBLISHED BY OXFORD UNIVERSITY PRESS, CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY PRESS, ROUTLEDGE, AND GLOBE PEQUOT.

OVER THE PAST 30 PLUS YEARS, MR. ADOLPHE HAS SERVED AS COMPOSER-IN-RESIDENCE AT MANY FESTIVALS AND INSTITUTIONS THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES FOR WHICH HE HAS ALSO CREATED AND LED EDUCATIONAL CONCERTS AND WORKSHOPS FOR ALL AGES AND LEVELS OF MUSICAL ACCOMPLISHMENT. A KEY FIGURE AT THE CHAMBER MUSIC SOCIETY OF LINCOLN CENTER SINCE 1992, MR. ADOLPHE IS THE FOUNDER AND DIRECTOR OF THE SOCIETY'S MEET THE MUSIC FAMILY CONCERT SERIES AND IS ALSO THE SOCIETY'S RESIDENT LECTURER. HE HAS APPEARED AS A COMMENTATOR ON LIVE FROM LINCOLN CENTER TELEVISION AND AS A REGULAR LECTURER AT THE METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART. THE AUTHOR OF FOUR BOOKS ON MUSIC, MR. ADOLPHE HAS TAUGHT AT YALE, JUILLIARD, AND NEW YORK UNIVERSITY AND IS A FREQUENT GUEST LECTURER AT COLLEGES AND CONSERVATORIES AROUND THE WORLD.



Elaine Rinaldi, Founder and Artistic Director of Orchestra Miami, is a Miami native who has chosen to return home and reinvest in her community.

Under her artistic supervision,
Orchestra Miami has performed high
quality classical music concerts to
literally thousands of people
through its annual "Beethoven on
the Beach" Free Outdoor Concerts
and introduced over 33,000 school
children to classical music through
its collaborations with the MiamiDade County Public Schools and the
Family Fun Concert series at
Pinecrest Gardens.

Her "Discover Miami Through Music" series has encouraged scores of Miamians to learn more about their city through music. In addition to her work in Miami, Ms. Rinaldi is one of the nation's top vocal coaches, focused on training the next generation of opera singers, and is a frequent guest conductor at opera companies and summer music festivals. She loves animals of all kinds, and encourages you to consider adopting a cat or dog from one of our local shelters or rescue groups.

Orchestra Miami consists of a select group of professional musicians, all permanent residents of South Florida, whose collective body is unparalleled in terms of musical excellence and experience. Our many collaborations with the Miami-Dade County Public Schools have introduced over 35,000 school-aged kids to classical music for free.
